Grace and peace to you my brothers and sisters of Jordan Memorial UMC,

we serve over 100 plates of food to people in our community. As we sit, I see many friends that I have gotten to know over the last year. Friends that come faithfully every month to the meal. Who I do not see are people from the church. Outside of the few workers, there is very little involvement to connect the church to these wonderful people. There are great stories shared and Holy moments experienced. In fact, I have no trouble saying I experience God closer and more real on Tuesday nights than Sunday mornings. Until we can recognize that Tuesday nights are just as, if not more important than Sunday mornings, we will not be able to grow as a church. Our love of neighbor and connection to the community must always be our mission and goal above anything else we try to do.

This goes beyond understanding Spanish or another language, this has to do with understanding the language of the community. The reality is that there are many people in our community that see the church as a foreign place. We don't speak the language of the people around us. We need to take time to listen and learn from our neighbors. We need to quit assuming we have the right answers and see what we can learn from those we serve. We need to be intentional about having conversation with new people. The only way to eliminate the concept of a stranger or foreigner is to get to know them. Once you have done that, those words disappear. Once you know someone, they can no longer be a stranger or a foreigner; they are friends. I hope you will prayerfully consider ways in which you can better connect this month and in the months to come. I truly believe that it is our connection that makes us stronger and will sustain us in the months and years to come. Will it be easy? Not always. Will it require change? Of course it will, but through the power of the Holy Spirit all things are possible, and I believe the Spirit is still at work in this place.



Mission Trip

On August 29th, we had five folks travel to Canton, NC to participate in Flood Relief work from the damaging floods in August of 2021. Ann and Wayne Hutchins, Larry Smith, Jaidy Smith, and Pastor Chris spent four days in the rural parts of the mountains working to help survivors from the devastating floods that happened over a year ago. During our trip we built three raised platforms for HVAC units to sit on, fixed some plumbing issues in one house, and installed a new gutter on a house. These small projects allowed four houses to be completed and marked as finished! We also enjoyed great fellowship within our small group as well as at a community meal at Cruso United Methodist Church. While there we were able to drive up and still see the damage from the flood where an entire side of the mountain was washed away. There will continue to be work to be done in the mountains as they recover from this natural disaster. Of course, as I write this there is a hurricane coming towards Florida and one passed over Puerto Rico a week ago. Disaster Response will always be needed and is one of the things I am most proud of as a United Methodist. We are usually the first ones in and the last ones out in disaster areas. We know there will be more opportunities to serve and hope you will consider joining us on our next trip.

We are beginning to look at dates in late January for a trip to Puerto Rico to help with disaster response there after this last storm. There are no special skills required and anyone can do it! We hope our group of five can grow and in our next trip have more folks get to experience how much of a blessing mission work can be. It is by being the hands and feet of Christ that we experience the body of Christ in the world.
