The Church of the Nativity is the traditional location of the birth of Jesus. Bethlehem sits on top of a mountain to the south of Jerusalem. The city today has sprawled down the hillsides in all directions, but at the time of Jesus, would have been just what is on top of the mountain. The hillsides that now contain buildings were the shepherd's fields where the angel of the Lord would have appeared to the shepherds that fateful night. After walking up the hill from the parking area you reach the Church of the Nativity. It was built in 339 AD by Constantine to commemorate the place of Jesus' birth. When you arrive, you are met by a funny door as the main entrance to the church. It is not decorated with fancy jewels or elaborate decorations; in fact, it doesn't look like an entrance at all. Pictured above is the entrance to the Church of Nativity; it is also called the Door of Humility. At four feet tall and two feet wide, it is barely an opening to enter this massive cathedral. Now while the main reason for a small door is centered around protecting the church from Ottoman raiders on horseback, the spiritual meaning cannot be overlooked. The only way to enter the church is to kneel. You have to bow down in order to enter the church. There is a story of a student talking to a Rabbi. The student asks, "In the olden days there were people who saw the face of God. Why don't they anymore?" The Rabbi replied, "Because nowadays no one can stoop that low."

As we entered the Church of the Nativity, we had to bend low in order to walk through the Door of Humility, but that is nothing compared to what God did that first Christmas as he bent down and entered the world through a humble baby. I love what the author Danielle Shroyer says in her book, Where Jesus Prayed: "When we prostrate ourselves to God, we are

merely mimicking what God has done for us." We love to fill our homes and churches with elaborate decorations, beautiful greenery and symbols and there is nothing wrong with this, but we must always be careful to never forget the humble state in which our Savior was born. Emmanuel means God with us, God came into our world, into our joys and into our pain, into our celebrations and into our grief, God knelt to the earth to be with us."

After you enter the church, you continue to go down. The church is built on top of a grotto or cave. First century homes would use the rock bed as a foundation, and in these caves would keep their animals and livestock to protect them from predators and other dangers. They would then build above that the residence where they lived. The word that our Bibles have translated as inn is not how we view an inn today; it literally means guest room. Most of us today have a guest room in our homes for when people visit; that was common in the first century as well. When Joseph arrives at a relative's house, there is no guest room available because someone is already there, so they make their way down into the basement, the cave below the home where the animals are kept. As you go down the steps you see a star inlaid over marble stone. The star has a glass center in which inside you can see a rock. The rock itself is the original bedrock of Bethlehem. There are 14 points on the star representing the three sets of 14 generations from David to Jesus. We read about these in the beginning of Matthew's Gospel. Tradition holds this is the place where Jesus was born. Once again you have to kneel, and you can reach into an alcove to touch the star which covers the rock of the cave. In this same room is a manger. Not a wooden trough as we picture today but a spot carved out in the rock to hold food and water. Again, you cannot help but be taken back by the humble nature to which God enters the world. Not in a palace but a dark cold cave, not laid in a soft bed but in a rock hewn feeding trough. Lower and lower God bends down to be with His people.

Because of the number of pilgrims making their way through this site, it is hard to fully grasp all that is happening; you get rushed through, get a quick photo op at the star, and then are escorted out. The hectic pace is a reminder of what Christmas has become. It has become a time at which we rush from event to event, service to service, and shopping center to mall, all in a furious race to get it all done. This season I want us to stop and slow down, take time to not rush but to kneel, to enter the Door of Humility of our hearts as we draw close to the presence of God in our lives. No one knows for sure if the star or that place really is where Jesus was born but that is not what matters. What matters is that he was born, and somewhere in Bethlehem the world was forever changed. Maybe that is the spot, maybe it's not. As I knelt at the star, even in that brief moment, all I could say was thank you. Thank you for kneeling low enough to meet me where I am. God continues to kneel to the earth to meet us in our pain and grief our sorrows and joys. God continues to be Emmanuel, God with us. If you are having trouble seeing Him, perhaps you are not looking low enough. It is only when we bow low that we can see the face of God.
