

Mason Eugene Siers, age 78, passed away Wednesday at the Heros Way Hospice at the Durham VA Medical Center. Born in Greenbrier County, West Virginia, he was the son of the late Dorlo Lee Siers and Audrey Gregory Siers. He was a member of the Jordan Memorial United Methodist Church in Ramseur, NC where he was past chairman of the Pastor-Parrish Relations Committee and the Finance Committee. He was a former member of the Optimist Club, the National Rifle Association, and the N.C. Taxidermist Association. He was involved with the Boy Scouts of America, and was a former Cub Scout and Boy Scout Leader along with the Order of the Arrow. He was a Veteran of the U.S. Air Force.

UWF News


