Greetings friends of Jordan Memorial UMC and happy start to your summer! This summer, we're doing something new—and we believe something necessary. Our sermon series, *Difficult Conversations & Courageous Questions*, will focus on the kinds of topics that can be uncomfortable, challenging, and even divisive.

Rather than avoid them, we want to bring them into the light with honesty, humility, and grace.

Each Sunday, instead of hearing from a single preacher, we'll gather around a panel of voices from our own church community. These individuals will reflect on the week's question or theme, offering their personal stories, insights, and experiences. But this won't be a one-way conversation. We're creating space for you to participate as well—through questions, reflections, and dialogue.

We believe that something sacred happens when people share their stories. When we speak from our lived experience—our struggles, our joys, our doubts, our faith—we invite others to see the topic through a new lens. Often, it's not facts or arguments that change us, but the power of someone's honest story. In this series, each voice becomes a window into a deeper understanding—not necessarily agreement, but empathy.

These conversations will be shaped not by the goal of consensus, but by the hope of connection. The goal of this series is *not* to achieve uniformity or persuade everyone to think the same way. Instead, our hope is to learn how to listen more deeply, speak more kindly, and love more fully—even when we disagree. In a world where disagreement so often leads to division, we're choosing a different path. We are not trying to change anyone's opinion or convince anyone to "get it right." Instead, our goal is to grow in our ability to listen, to learn, and to love across differences.

We recognize that within our congregation, there is a wide range of beliefs and perspectives. That's not a problem to solve, it's a gift to embrace. These diverse experiences can help us see God and one another more fully.
